**Meeting called to order** at 12:04 p.m.

**Present:** Melissa Barclay, Brenda Berning, Amanda Brees, Craig Brooks, Judge Clark, Felicia Decker, Paul Hoch, Josie Koenigs, Lea Kralewski, Mike Osmond, Ryan Raymond, Gina Rieck, Dave Rynders, Danielle Schalinski, Heidi Stewart, Julie Vollmer, and Mary Campbell Wood

**Public Comments regarding Agenda items:** None.

**Review/Discussion/Action – Minutes of the May 16, 2023:** Mr. Brooks accepted motion to approve minutes as presented, seconded by Osmond. Motion carried.

**Review/Discussion/Action – Buffalo County Jail Drug Testing Data ~ Sheriff Osmond:** Sheriff Osmond presented drug testing data being done in Buffalo County Jail from 1/1/23 through 5/31/23. Please see the presentation below. Sheriff Osmond stated there is one exception to the results; not all females arrested have come through Buffalo County Jail as they have been housing them in Pepin County Jail the last couple of months. He stated of all those drugs tested 62 % were non-residents and 38% were residents. 61% of all the drug tests were positive. He clarified that not all individuals in jail are tested, for example people coming from other jails. Those inmates who were tested 83% were positive and 17% were negative. Those victim crimes (domestic, theft, any crime where there are two parties, and one is a victim) 86% tested positive and 14% tested negative. Substances testing for are amphetamine (AMP), buprenorphine (BUP) tests for opioids, benzodiazepine (BZO), cocaine (COC), ethyl glucuronide (ETG) – alcohol, fentanyl (FEN), methylenedioxymethamphetamine (MDMA) – ecstasy or molly, methamphetamine (MET), methadone (MTD), tetrahydrocannabinol (THC). When asked what trends he is seeing Sheriff Osmond stated heroin is getting phased out by fentanyl. He is concerned that methamphetamine tested higher than alcohol. When you get a positive test on methamphetamine you will also see a positive test with amphetamine; however, amphetamine stays in your system longer. Seeing an upward trend with fentanyl use. Mr. Richmond inquired if the testing was urine or blood, and the Sheriff replied, “urine.” Also asked if testing is voluntary, the Sheriff replied, “yes.” Sheriff Osmond stated if subject refuses to test the inmate will stay in a holding cell for the first 12 hours and will not get moved into general population especially if the individual is exhibiting signs of under the influence and the staff does not know what they

have ingested. Drug testing was implemented January 1, 2023, for the safety and liability of the inmate and jail staff.

If the inmate is held on a bond violation staff needs to have a cause to request a drug test for example inmate charged with possession of meth staff now has a cause to drug test and will. For non-drug related will not do drug test unless suspicion under the influence. Ms. Stewart inquired if Pepin County is drug testing. Ms. Berning stated the staff started testing in June. CJCC is funding the drug tests in both counties. Judge Clark wanted to make sure the district attorney's office in both counties are informed of the drug test jail data as it may have an impact on disposition. He also stated these results would indicate that referrals to CJS might be appropriate in certain circumstances.

Mr. Brooks made a motion to continue to fund the project and receive annual reports from Buffalo and Pepin Counties, seconded by Ms. Campbell Wood. Ms. Stewart made a motion to amend the original motion to have monthly reporting, seconded by Ms. Campbell Wood. Sheriff Osmond was uncertain if he could provide the necessary data monthly. A roll call vote was taken. All voting yes, Sheriff Osmond abstaining. Judge Clark stated CJCC will allocate \$1,200 - \$1,500 to this project per year. All voting members voted yes, except for Sheriff Osmond who abstained. Motion carried.

**Review/Discussion/Action – Pepin County Jail Drug Testing data ~ Mr. Roessler:**

Not present.

**Review/Discussion/Action – Survey of top 3 goals the CJCC members would like the committee to work on – Status/Response ~ Ms. Campbell Wood:** Ms. Campbell Wood stated 6 people responded to the survey. The CJCC Survey Summary Report is below. Ms. Campbell Wood stated one of the goals was to create and/or support re-entry programs. She informed committee members there is a reentry program that has been active for over 3 years in both jails. She also stated the goals we produce should align with our vision and mission statement. She pointed out a member would like to see more services that support veterans. Judge Clark stated he did not respond to survey because CJCC currently provides a forum for any interested member of public or members of CJCC to put forth ideas about how they see improvements to the criminal justice system and for that reason he did not see a need to respond to the survey. He encouraged anybody who had ideas to share them. Stated the CJCC committee has advanced programs such as BPLA, Jail Re-entry, Court Diversion and Veteran Programs and this was done by committee members coming forward with sound ideas. Judge Clark stated if he were to choose a number one priority it would be launching the new CJS Pre-Charge Program. Judge Clark is uncomfortable with the idea of needing a new mission statement unless we have an alternative to bring forward to the committee. Ms. Campbell Wood encouraged the committee to review the current CJCC mission statement and think of ways it could be improved. Ms. Berning and Ms. Campbell Wood will work on the CJCC mission statement outside of the CJCC meeting and bring a proposal back to the committee. Ms. Stewart suggested adding the priorities to the agenda monthly. Ms. Brees inquired how she can get items placed on the CJCC agenda. Ms. Berning informed her to email her directly.

**Review/Discussion/Action – CJCC By-Laws – Google Document Status/Response ~ Ms. Campbell Wood:** See below for responses.

**Review/Discussion/Action – Conversation regarding Minnesota legalizing marijuana, Wisconsin marijuana usage to increase. Suggestion to develop/establish tracking data for Wisconsin use increase? ~ CJCC Committee Members:**

Sheriff Osmond expressed his concern that Buffalo County is going to see an increase in marijuana since Minnesota legalized it. He also stated he spoke with a Sheriff whose county borders Michigan and they saw a huge rise of Wisconsin residents going to Michigan and bring back marijuana for profit. Sheriff Osmond anticipates the same outcome in Buffalo County. He stated there should be a rise in referrals to the new CJS Pre-charge Diversion Program with individuals possessing marijuana. He also stated it is especially important to differentiate between for profit drug dealer and simple possession. Judge Clark inquired with Sheriff Osmond if he was satisfied with the structure of ordinance, felony, and diversion. Sheriff Osmond stated he was and will be working with officers to issue more diversion versus ordinance tickets.

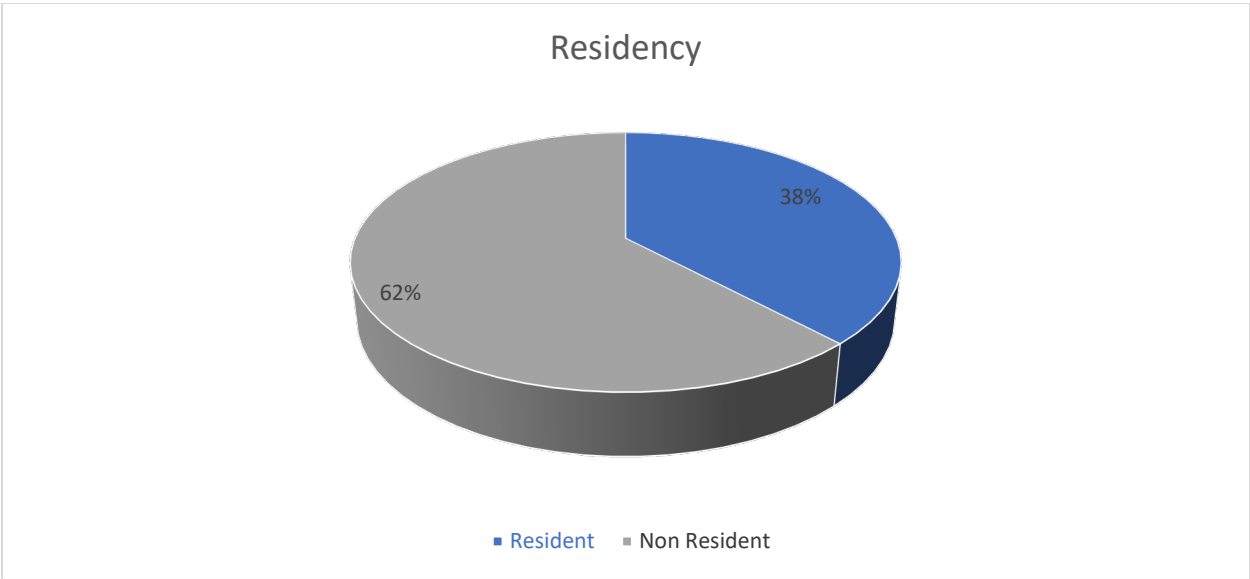

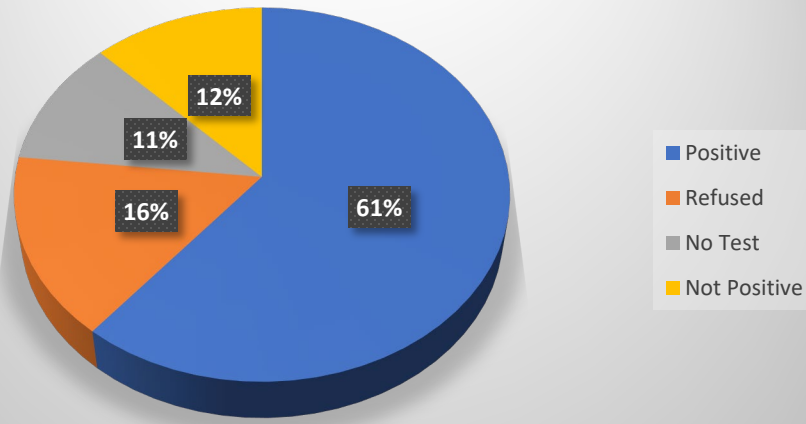

# BUFFALO COUNTY JAIL – DRUG TEST DATA

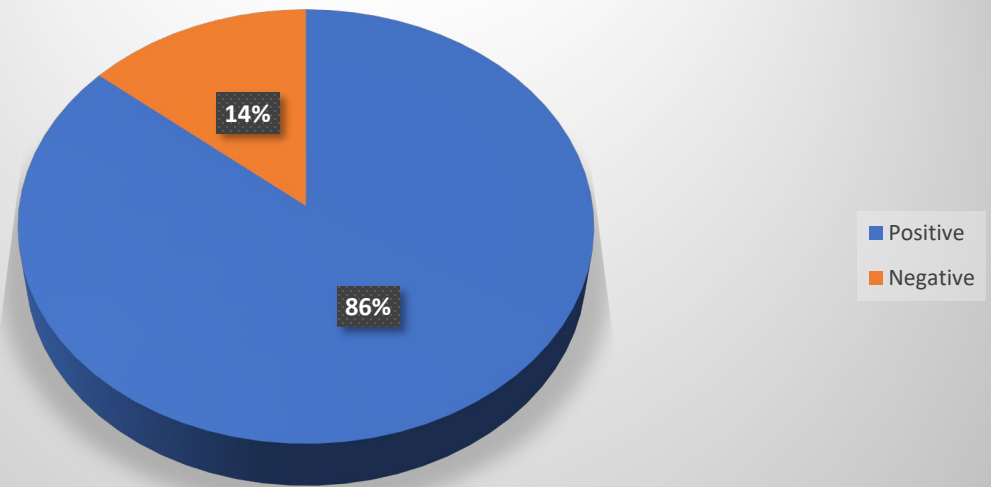

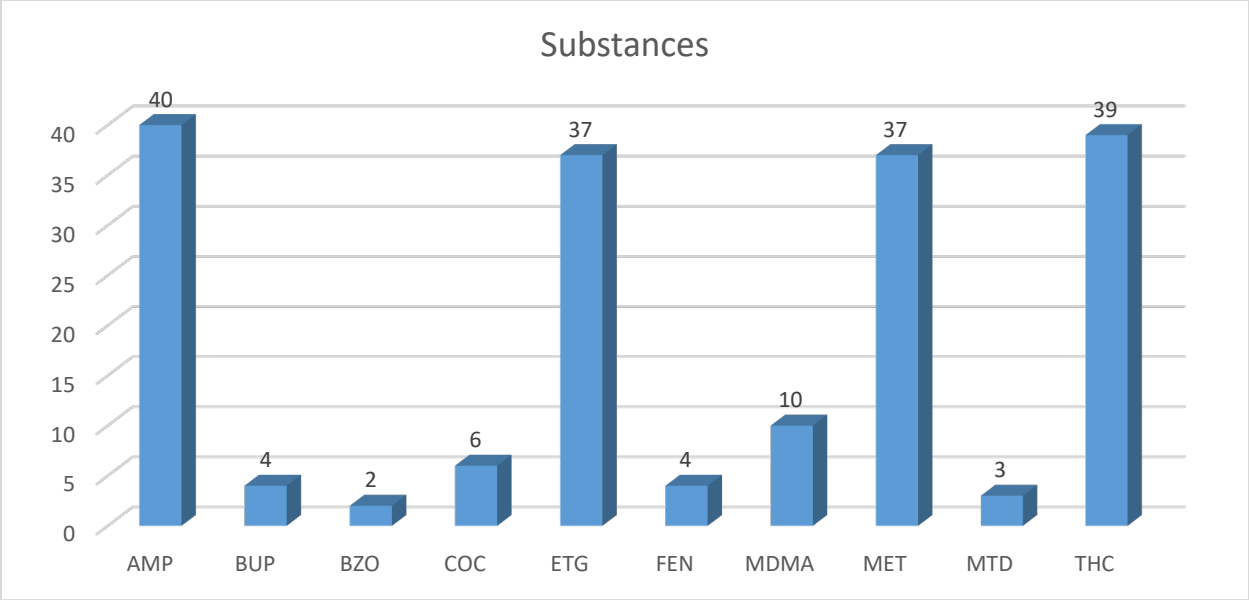


### Test Results

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# CJCC Survey Summary Report, June 2023

## *Buffalo-Pepin CJCC Priorities/Goals next 12-18 months*

1	Developing and communicating a clear and complete Vision and Mission, bylaws, structure, and operating procedures. This could include special workgroups.
2	Providing individuals with the tools to prevent further or new criminal activity.
3	Priority should be shifting away from supervision of services/ departments and collaboration. Currently CJCC acts too much like a supervisory committee where different players are giving monthly reports. CJCC should be discussion on how different players can help one another and then they meet separately outside CJCC not report to CJCC

**Q2 - Please share what you think should be the second most important priority/goal for the Buffalo-Pepin CJCC in the next 12-18 months by writing a brief description below.**

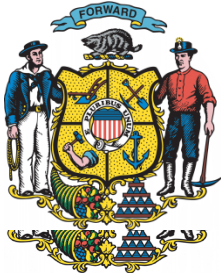
1	Launching the pre-charge diversion program

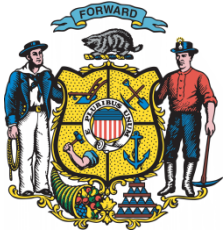

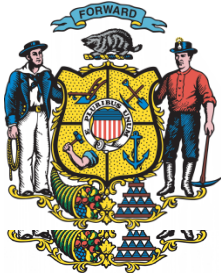

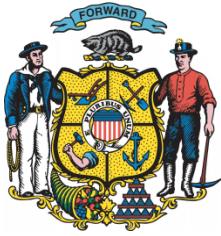
